Now you are ready – you have the time, energy and land to make your dreams a reality. But the election may seem overwhelming. So, where to start? This is really the first question you have to ask yourself. Some things to think about: what are your reasons why you want to farm? What knowledge do you have about agriculture – work, techniques, and how to garden? Will you be able to kill an animal or part with one you have become attached to? Before you clean your local livestock newspaper, take a step back. What are your goals for your little farm? What farm are you planning? It could be a hobby farm where your farm is a supplement to working full time, something relaxing you can do for fun in the evenings and on weekends. It may be that you want your farm to actually make money, eventually replacing your current job. Or, your goal might be to produce all the food (and maybe power) that you and your family need - homestead or self-sufficiency. The small farm can range from a mid-acre with several laying hens and a small veggie garden, to 40 acres with cattle, dairy cows, sheep, goats, chickens, pigs, and acres of field crops and veggies. Some of your options will be limited by your country and resources, but we'll get to it later. First, let yourself be dreamed of. What animals appeal to you? What vegetables, fruits and grains do you want to grow? Make a list of everything you imagine on your farm - even if it's years from now. This is your dream, your ideal little farm. Evaluating your land will give you the information you need to put your vision in the last step two and plan your first year of agriculture. Here's where you take your dreams with reality. Check out your list of things you want to grow and the animals you want to raise. Read something about each animal to get a sense of how much space and care they need. Now check the farm resources. Do you have enough pasture land for those five cows, or do you have to build that over time? Do you have the financial resources to buy fencing for goats? If you plan to start a farm, you will want to write a whole farm business plan. Dreaming and evaluating you've just done will help you get started with your mission, which is a great place to start. Farm planning is an ongoing process, an ongoing work. Before you implement your plan, you may find that you need to adjust. Each season, keep your dream list out of step two and a pencil-and-paper sketch of your country from step three. Have your dreams changed? Is there more to add or things that now you know you don't want to do? Sit down with your farm plan every year and decide what you want to deal with spring, summer and autumn. Before you know it, you'll be on your way to making your little farm dream a reality. Reality.
